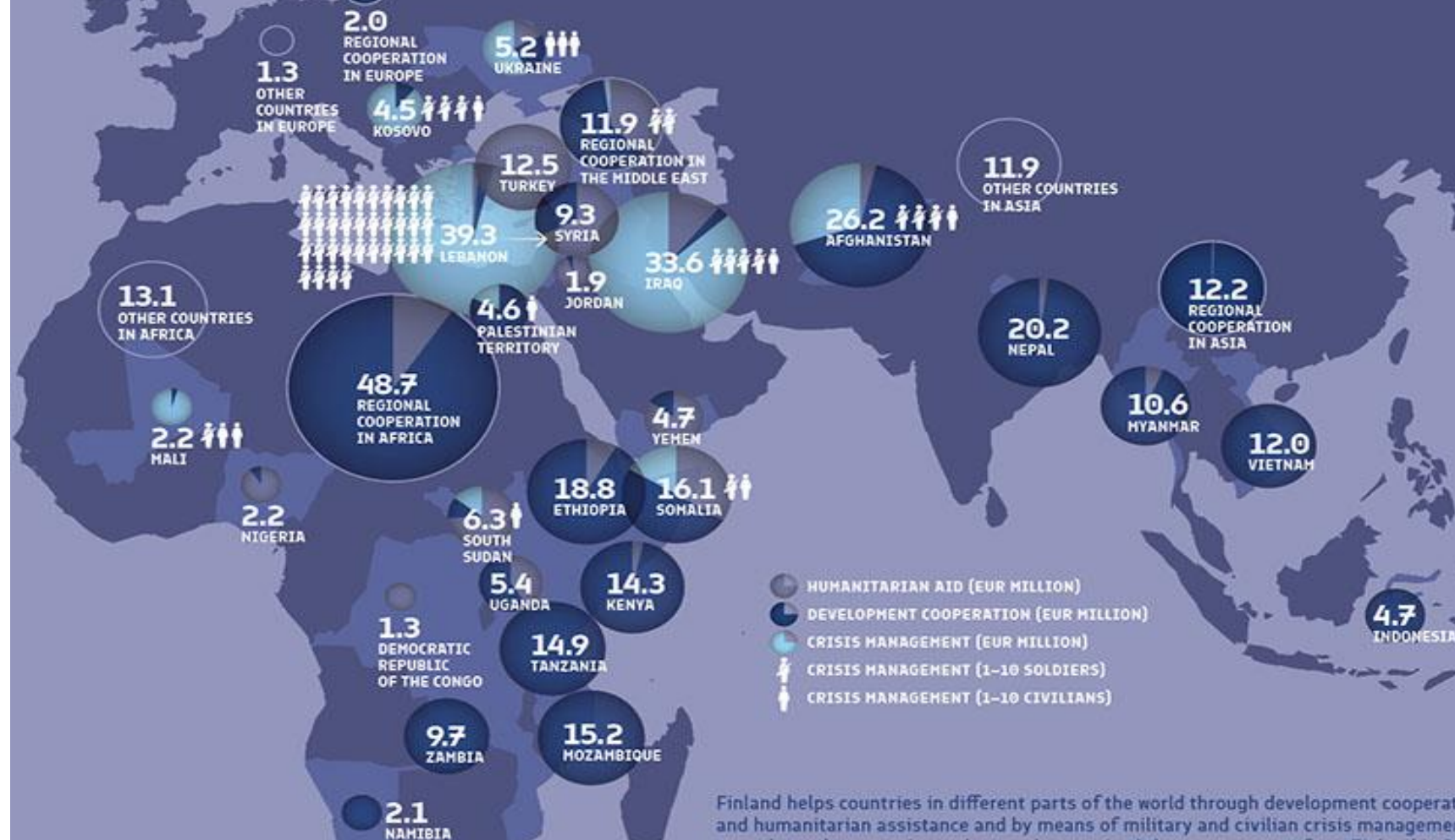

# Education of Refugees and Internally displaced in Finland's Dev. Cooperation and Humanitarian Aid

- Education is the biggest sector of development co-operation in Palestine Territory (Gaza, East-Jerusalem, Area-C)
- Also in other long-term partner countries where Finland has a education sector programme, there are refugee and/or internally displaced populations (Ethiopia, Myanmar, Afghanistan, Nepal, Mozambique, Ukraine)
- Finnish Civil Society Organizations work in Education in Emergencies with refugees e.g. in Uganda

## In Palestine, the objectives are

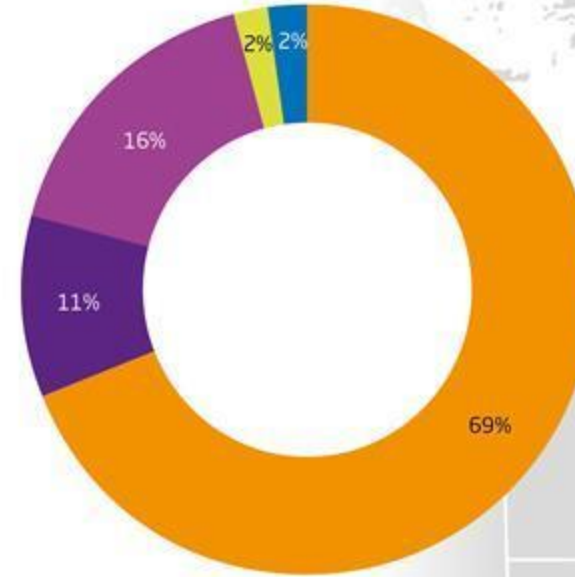
### 1. Quality education

- Provision of quality education to all Palestinian children
- Improved teacher education and pre-school education

### 2. Improved living conditions for people living in the vulnerable areas (Gaza, Area C and East Jerusalem).

- Provision of better basic services, clean water and waste management for people in Gaza
- Improved economic opportunities and better living conditions for people
- Local projects to support women's employment

In accordance with the state budget, the appropriations for 2016-2019 amount to EUR 21.9 million.



The cooperation between the Government of Finland and the partner country's government is steered by the Country Strategies. The Country Strategies determine the areas, forms of support and objectives of the cooperation and make risk management plans. They are based on the partner country's own development plans. The areas of cooperation are agreed in collaboration with the partner country and other donors. The results of the work are evaluated using the indicators defined in the Country Strategies.

- UNESCO – Board membership 2017-21
- UNICEF – Education in Emergencies e.g. No Lost Generation – Education Syrian refugee children and Youth in Syria and neighboring countries
- Multilateral development banks - funding for education in low income and fragile states – e.g. WB IDA
- Global Partnership for Education – all funding for education mainly for low income and fragile states
- Higher Education and Research e.g. in Eritrea, Palestine
- Global Education in Schools
